How do I...



Q: Get help from the library while filing my taxes?

A: We are happy to help you find the documents that you need to print in order to file your taxes. Please call ahead to the Adult Services Desk (515-222-3403) to make sure we have what you need. You can always use our Internet stations to print from the IRS and State of Iowa tax sites (printing/copying = 20 cents/page). We also have books to check out with hints tips and steps for preparing your own tax return and related topics.

Federal Taxes: The WDM Library does NOT carry loose forms or booklets. The Library makes some masters of major forms, instructions and tables, which can be photocopied at 20 cents/page. You can also find them online.

State Taxes: The State no longer provides any forms to libraries, and most forms are online-only. We will make a few masters of major forms for you to photocopy (20 cents/page) once the forms are published (usually by mid-February) – anything else can be found on the <u>State of Iowa tax site</u>.

Writing From Your Roots w/ Author Carol Roh Spaulding


Tuesday, February 6 - 6:30 - 7:30 PM

Club Read & Book Club Social: Hybrid Edition! Monday, February 12 & 26 - 7:00 - 8:45 PM


