Database Spotlight: Opposing Viewpoints

Opposing Viewpoints is a continually updated database that collects articles, essays, and opinion pieces to present analysis of all sides of trending issues. New material from publications like the New York Times, The Washington Post, and The American Conservative is added daily. The material presented often includes critical thinking questions and is helpful to teachers, students and life-long learners looking to hone and support arguments in papers and debates, or simply to prompt discussion. Recent issues include congressional redistricting resulting from the 2020 census, COVID mitigation policies on campuses in 2021, and the 2021-22 National Debate Topic exploring whether the federal government should increase the protection of water resources. Access is free to all in the library and limited to WDM library card holders when accessed remotely.


Author Visit: Lydia Sigwarth
