Each online training course is made up of short one- to three-minute video segments, so you can learn at your own pace. All training is online and on-demand, available anywhere with internet access, with no need to download software.

It is a great fit for middle and high school students and adults who have a foundation in English grammar and reading but need resources to help build knowledge, conduct research and improve study skills.

<u>KidSpeak™</u> is a fun, age-appropriate online language course designed for children ages 6 and up! Patrons get unlimited access to online language courses, packed with pronunciation, speech, grammar, writing and vocabulary-building lessons. All you need to get started is your library card number.
