A: Love to read? Having trouble getting to the library for health reasons? The West Des Moines Public Library has a service that can help!

In 2021, library staff and volunteers made over 930 homebound deliveries to people in their individual homes. This program allow WDM residents who have difficulty coming into the library access to library materials - no matter what their living situation

A WDM library card is required. All materials checkout for one month.




